CQ to all hams, It's that time again

Saturday, March 12, 2022 (0900-1600 PST)... USS Midway Aircraft Carrier Museum (NI6IW) will be active, commemorating the launch of the USS Midway on March 20, 1945, commissioned on Sept 10th and underway on Oct 12, 1945

NI6IW will be utilizing the PAPA System for D-Star Operations from 9am to 4pm PST, which is 1700 to 2400 UTC on the following PAPA repeaters:

Reflector 012A & PAPA D-STAR repeaters

MIDWAY NI6IW will be operating on or near its normal HF frequencies of 7.250 MHz LSB, 14.320 MHz USB AND 070 PSK31 frequencies (check spotting networks for the most current information). MOXON - Build it! - Day In The Park

When: On Saturday, April 2, 2022,

Time: 1:00 until 3:00 PM.

Where: **Meet at the Raytheon Employee's Park** [The entrance is just east of the intersection of PCH (aka Sepulveda) and El Segundo Blvd.

Going east from the intersection, turn right at the first opportunity.]

There will be Guard Shack:

Show a Picture Id (Driver's License) and Say, "You're Meeting a Group in the Park."

As you pull past the Kiosk, Go Right (It's **One Way**, so there is No choice and it's 3 lanes wide).

You will immediately see the Park on your Right, first tennis courts. Drive as far as the Walk-In Entrance that you'll see on the Right.

But then turn **Left-** And Park in the Lot on the Left (Large Lot). (If you pass the flagpole, and 9-11 Memorial, on your right, you've gone too far.)

It's 100 to 150 Yards to the tables, so if you have anything significant to carry, a small cart is a good Idea.

<u>2022 Field Day - W6HA – June</u>

Pine Campground at Redondo Beach's

Wilderness Park is indeed Secured according to our fearless leader, President, Brian, AB6UI. The usual activity, Usually actually starts the Thursday before the weekend, to bring our 55 foot portable tower to the park, shortly before it closes on Thursday afternoon, 4:00 PM to avoid other park visitors. We would be legal by FD rules after 4:00 PM (0000 UTC Friday). The idea is to do this when there is a minimal number of visitors at the park for safety reasons. The more important FD rule is that you may only use 24 of the 42 hours before the start to setup. So after the Portable Tower is moved to the pad in Pine Camp Ground and secured, we do nothing more until Friday morning, 14 or 15 hours later. Then we setup during the day on Friday, but knock-off about 7 or 8 PM. There are usually some last minute things to do Saturday morning and the Operating period (some say contest period) begins at 11:00 AM (1800z).

Station Captains: Some board members tentatively took some Station Captain positions. But, if this a desirement of yours, let us know. Our usual set of stations is:

- 1. 80/15 Meter station in MMQs Big Blue tent Dale, WB6MMQ Captain, "but, at 77 years young, I'll need help, setting up and operating."
- 2. 20 Meters, Richard, KM6FP;
- 3. Up for grabs is 40/10 Meters and 10 meters is starting to pick up. Check the solar report.

- 4. VHF, Howard, KE6MAK, has tentatively said he will organize VHF, but is open to letting someone else have it so he can help me at the 80/15 meter station which I am very happy to share
- 5. Usually we also have a GOTA (Get-On-The-Air) Station.
- 6. Information / Talk-in Table offers public contact with other campers at Wilderness Park. Setup tasks on Friday are: Assembling the tri-band beam and mounting it on the tower; running power cords to the generator in the maintenance yard (100+ feet away, 200' to 40m and 300' to VHF) and running the E-Net cables for logging computers, not to mention setting up tents, EZe-Ups and moving tables and chairs & lights into position. The key is, "lots of hands make short work." So, if operating the contest (ARRL, "It's not a T") portion, is not your thing, there is lots of FUN to be had and stuff to be learned during setup - and, of course, we are almost 'Famous' for tearing it all down by 4PM Sunday afternoon, by the time the park closes, at 4 PM. We're usually out by 3PM, sometimes earlier, and on our way home. But this "Decamping" needs plenty of hands.

So as Brian mentioned last month, "It's time to start thinking about <u>Field Day 2022</u>, **June 25-26**, **2022**, (actually 24, 25, 26) always the last full weekend in June." There is also a task for someone to coordinate some coffee and food. This team runs on its Belly and Caffeine.

Nonprofit Status

<u>March:</u> The wheels of government turned this last month, and the "501(c)(3) Determination Letter" was received. We are now a nonprofit by the Secretary of State of California, and the IRS. One entity remains.

That is the California Franchise Tax Board (FTB). They usually follow the IRS' lead. The procedure is to file their form #3500A. This is a one page form, identifying the Club, to which the IRS' "Determination Letter" is attached. The Treasurer, Paul, KK6TAC, has already filled it out, attached a copy of the 'Determination Letter' and sent it to the Franchise Tax Board.

Last month, I that mentioned we were also waiting on a 'Certified Copy' of the <u>SI-100</u> filed with the Secretary of State (SOS) on December 30, 2021. That has also been received. So, all the "hard work" has been done.

Going forward, there is only one thing for the Secretary to do and two things for the Treasurer to do to maintain our corporate nonprofit status:

- 1. Every two years, the SI-100 needs to be filed, informing the SOS of who the officers are and that the club still functions. If an election changes the officers, (mainly the President, Secretary or Treasurer) an interim SI-100 is filed. (BTW this is also required by the bank and desired by the ARRL to maintain our affiliation.) The time for this filing is from July 1st to November 30th, in odd numbered years, since we formed in 2021.
- 2. Every year the Treasurer files two forms, electronically. The IRS Form 990-EZ and the Franchise Tax Board form FTB 199N. The main item on these forms is the gross receipts of the Corporation over the last year which the Treasurer needs to know anyway. So just fill in the blank, and click send.

ARRL Letter - Excerpts of Possible Interest Dayton Hamvention Looks to Be a Go

for 2022 [From Feb.22] Hams and vendors hoping to attend Dayton Hamvention[®] 2022 have



been asking what, if any, COVID-19 regulations will be in place at the event. Hamvention General Chairman Rick Allnutt, WS8G, issued a statement: "We strongly anticipate that Hamvention 2022 is a go. We cannot guarantee what government may decide about unknown changes in the pandemic. It has become obvious that the State of Ohio is very unlikely to call a halt to large gatherings anytime soon. Despite a recent large spike in [Omicronvariant] COVID cases and hospitalizations, there is no move to restrict large indoor or outdoor events such as sports events," Allnutt said.

... official state guidance may be to recommend -not require -- face masks and social distancing, but does not expect to be checking attendees' vaccination status on site. ...

Updates on Hamvention and COVID-19 regulations related to the event will be posted on the Hamvention website.

Hamvention, an ARRL-sanctioned event, will be held May 20 - 22, at the Greene County Fairgrounds and Expo Center in Xenia, Ohio.

Some New Rules Going into Effect this Year for ARRL Field Day

After taking a few detours over the past couple of years due to the COVID-19 pandemic, <u>ARRL</u>
Field Day rules are being updated

on a permanent basis starting this summer. ARRL conducted a Field Day community survey with invitations propagated far and wide, and direct emails sent to more than 15,000 individuals and ARRL-affiliated clubs. After sorting through, reviewing, and discussing the survey results, the ARRL Programs and Services Committee recommended a number of rule changes for ARRL Field Day, which will take place this year over the June 25 - 26 weekend.

Starting this year, the maximum PEP output for a transmitter used by anyone submitting a Field Day log will be 100 W. The power multiplier of 2 will remain in place, and the high-power category will be removed from the rules. Until this year, the maximum low-power limit had been 150 W for most ARRL-sponsored operating events. The power multiplier will remain at 5 for QRP participants running a maximum of 5 W or less. As previously announced, 100 W is now the low-power category limit for all ARRL and IARU HF Contests, effective January 1, 2022.

A couple of changes instituted initially as accommodations for the COVID-19 pandemic will remain. Class D (Home) stations will continue to be able to earn points for contacts with other Class D stations. The club aggregate scoring change initiated in 2020, will become part of the permanent rules. In this aggregate scoring plan, the scores of individual stations are combined under the score of a single club.

Another change, involving Rule 7.3.2 Media Publicity, has been modified. Rules to date have offered 100 bonus points for attempting to obtain publicity and demonstrating same. With the ease of posting via Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, and various other media websites, Field Day participants will now be required to obtain publicity, not just try to do so. Any combination of bona fide media hits would qualify for the bonus points. For example, posting the details of your upcoming or ongoing Field Day activity, or your Field Day results, on a club or news media site, on


Facebook, or via Twitter and Instagram would meet the bonus criteria. Photos and videos are encouraged as part of media posts.

The K7RA Solar Update [complete article can be found on www.W6HA.com in the March 10th ARRL Ltr – ed]

Tad Cook, K7RA, Seattle, reports: We watched an active sun this week. Geomagnetic indicators peaked on Saturday, March 5, when Alaska's high latitude college A index reached 42.

Again this week, sunspots covered the sun each day. Average daily sunspot numbers rose from 44 to 87.4, and average daily solar flux went from 98.5 to 115.5. Geomagnetic indicators were also higher. Average daily planetary A index increased from 7.3 to 11.4.

Sunspot numbers for March 3 - 9 were 92, 77, 95, 82, 84, 93, and 89, with a mean of 87.4. The 10.7-centimeter flux was 110.9, 113.1, 120.1, 115.7, 118.3, 115.3, & 114.8, with a mean of 115.5. Estimated planetary A indices were 5, 10, 27, 18, 9, 6, & 5, with a mean of 11.4. Middle latitude A index was 3, 7, 19, 13, 7, 5, & 4, with a mean of 8.3.




